### RMC Bailey Scholarship Program

**DEADLINE TO APPLY IS FEB. 5** 

Young people are searching for meaningful vocations as they make plans after high school. Do you know someone considering a call to Christian ministry? Whether it's a call to



preaching, mission work, faith-based non-profit leadership, music ministry, youth ministry, chaplaincy... the Church needs young leaders who are prepared to guide us into the future.

Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, VA is the oldest continuously operating Methodist College in the U.S. and is committed to nurturing a new generation of church leaders. The Bailey Scholars program awards a half-tuition scholarship for the first two years followed by a full tuition scholarship for a student's final two years at R-MC.

Bailey Scholars also benefit from two internships (one for academic credit and one for a \$3,000 stipend) and a weekly meeting with other pre-ministerial students. Bailey Scholars complete their B.A. or B.S. degree (their major/minor is their choice) at Randolph-Macon College and then they select an A.T.S. accredited seminary/theology school to pursue a Masters Degree that best suits their call and the requirements of their tradition/denomination. Students from all Christian traditions are welcome into the program.



### BCRS Serving 500+ Families Weekly in 2023

In 2024 the Belmont Food Pantry will celebrate its 20th Anniversary! When the food pantry started in 2004, it was just a handful of



Belmont UMC members providing food to help their neighbors in need. Today, Belmont Community Resources Services, a nonprofit, oversees the Belmont Food Pantry and The Closet@Belmont which provides food, clothing, and a listening ear every Friday to more than 500 families.

Rev. Larry Tingle (retired) and wife Nancy (Bon Air UMC, see photo below) are regular volunteers, taking time to visit and pray with the more than 350+ families who come through the drive-thru to receive food. An additional 150+ families walk up for food and are typically greeted by Pam and Greg Chamblin (Woodlake UMC). Many families also visit The Closet@Belmont where they can shop for clothes, shoes, diapers, feminine products, and other household necessities at no cost. Donations from UMC churches, local grocery stores, and other community partners amounted to more than 600,000 pounds of food in 2023 and feed over 60,000 people. A special thank you to Trinity UMC, Westover Hills UMC, River Road UMC, and Woodlake UMC who bring food and clothes donations every week.

More than 9,000 volunteer hours were donated by UMC members in 2023 which helped support a more than 40% growth in the program. They are currently looking for Spanish-speaking volunteers, van drivers, parking lot greeters, and food drive donations.
